

PUBLIC INFO MEETING IS OCT. 22 FOR CURRIE RD. PAVING, 8 MILE to 10 MILE

The Road Commission for Oakland County (RCOC), in partnership with Lyon Township, will host a public information meeting Tuesday, Oct. 22, to share information about the planned paving of Currie Road between 8 Mile and 10 Mile roads, which will occur in 2020 through 2022. Phase one of the work is expected to start Oct. 1, 2020. The second phase is expected to start on Oct. 1, 2021.

MEETING DETAILS

WHAT: Public information meeting to discuss the construction plans and the impact on traffic during construction.

WHEN: Tuesday, Oct. 22, 2019

- WHERE: Lyon Township offices 58000 Grand River Ave, New Hudson, MI 48165
- **NOTE:** The meeting will be "open house" format. There will not be a formal presentation. Anyone can attend any time between 4 pm and 7 pm to review information and speak with an RCOC representative.

PROJECT DETAILS

Phase one (2020-21) will include improvements to roadway drainage, asphalt paving from approximately 500 feet north of 9 Mile Road to 10 Mile Road, placement of concrete curbs and gutters and intersection improvements at 10 Mile Road.

Phase two (2021-22) will include improvements to road way drainage, asphalt paving from 500 feet south of 8 Mile to 500 feet north of 9 Mile Road, placement of concrete curbs and gutters, construction of a compact roundabout at 9 Mile Road and construction of a single lane roundabout at 8 Mile Road.

IMPACT ON TRAFFIC

Currie Road between 8 Mile Road and 10 Mile Road will be closed to through traffic during construction phases. The intersections of Currie Road and 8 Mile and 9 Mile roads will be closed during the intersection improvement portions of the project.

Access to properties along this section of Currie Road will be maintained at all times during the project.

FUNDING

This project is expected to cost approximately \$5.5 million and will be paid for with federal road funds and matching dollars from RCOC, Lyon Township and Oakland County general government (through the Tri-Party Program). Washtenaw County will contribute funding for the Currie Road/8 Mile Road roundabout and for the southern approach to the intersection
