BRIGHTON, Mich. — The Huron-Clinton Metroparks is proud to partner with REI Co-Op as a destination to #optoutside on Friday, November 29.

Five years ago, REI made a made the decision to close its doors on Black Friday and instead encourage employees, members and the public to spend the day with family and friends outdoors. The movement has grown over the years, and this year it expands to challenge people to #OptOutside by Opting to Act.

Opting to Act asks not just its employees and members, but everyone to make a deliberate act to better the environment. Starting October 23 and until Black Friday, REI will be redoubling their volunteer commitment to park and trail clean ups. Invasive shrubs, brought to the United States for landscaping and wildlife habitat, have now taken over many prairies, wetlands, and forest understories. They have become a detriment to our ecosystem by crowding out native plants. Native biodiversity is extremely important to support wildlife, native bees, and other insects. Volunteers are a critical part of positively impacting natural areas we wouldn't be able to otherwise! Your help allows the Metroparks to protect unique ecosystems that will be enjoyed for generations to come.

Your Metroparks also offers opportunities to #OptOutside on Black Friday. The Metroparks invite you to explore, experience and enjoy the many trails, nature and farm centers, and activities available this season.
