



HCCC COLLECTIVE IMPACT REPORT

In Response to the COVID-19 Crisis



From 3/15 - 4/30/2020, OLHSA has:

- UW Emergency Rent for 1 at \$1,000.00
- Utility Assistance for 22 at \$16,464.50
- Housing (including Emergency Shelter) for 58 at \$24,554.95
- Shelter Only for 29 at \$12,090.00
- Weeks of Shelter 53; Shelter Calls 178; Eviction Calls 32; Rapid Rehousing Calls 56; Case Management Calls 373
- Homeless Preference List Calls 25
- Food Boxes Distributed 18,603



March 17th - April 30th:

- Served 4,956 prepared meals through the Mobile Lunch program (at lunch sites and delivered to homeless families)
- Had 4,395 people visit our Mobile Lunch program
- Provide 12,406 pounds of food through our Pantry
- Provided breakfast, lunch and snack boxes for 637 Howell School kids
- Had 238 volunteers that provided over 655 hours of service
- Provided 800 bed nights of shelter
- Assisted 23 people with rent - \$8,548
- Assisted 32 people with utilities - \$6,356



Livingston Family Center has:

- Received 61 calls/request for aid on 24/7 line
- Sheltered 4 youth (18-21), 2 children (5 months and 15 months)
- Assisted 15 people directly with food and hygiene items
- Donated several food and hygiene items to The Salvation Army
- Spent \$3,500 on food, hygiene, and technology to maintain therapy and case management contacts with youth

March 15-April 30, 2020:

- Number of calls: 115
- Number of people sheltered: 46
- Number of people assisted (in addition to shelter): 83
- (rent, insurance, food, gasoline, auto repair, clothing, other)
- Dollars Spent: \$26,111
- Number weeks shelter 77; Person-weeks of shelter: 90

Since March 15th:

- CASA has continued to serve 87 youth
- Supervised Visitation Program has conducted 72 virtual family visits
- 83 people officially participated in the virtual Denim Day campaign
- Legal (Personal Protection Orders and other legal support) helped 82 people
- Shelter provided care for 9 survivors
- Children's Program is providing clinical services for 72 survivors
- Adult Services is providing clinical services for 153 survivors
- SANE exam-1 survivor, CARE-6 children
- Virtual assailant group - 64 people
- Transitional Housing - 26 people
- Healthy Families continued to service 36 Families
- Father's Only class began virtually for 4 people
- Nurturing Parenting group began virtually for 15 people
- Created a High School Dating Smart Video called Dating Smart-Dating Abuse and Dating Smart-Sexual Assault & Consent.
- Partnered with Gleaners to provided just over 50 meals





Our Goal

Develop and coordinate a continuum of housing and services for homeless individuals and families and those at-risk of homelessness in Livingston County.



SUPPORTIVE SERVICES FOR VETERAN FAMILIES (SSVF):



From 3/15 - 4/30/2020, SSVF has:

- Received 9 requests for aid
- Sheltered 17 people (placed in or kept housed)
- Assisted 8 households
- Spent: \$6,371.51 to keep Veterans and their families safely housed

SEVERE WEATHER NETWORK LIVINGSTON COUNTY



Since March 15th, SWN has:

- Received approximately 25 or more direct contacts requesting aid
- Worked with Cornerstone Church, The Salvation Army, Bountiful Harvest and Second Chance to collaborate efforts to feed the homeless
- Spent \$2,600 to assist 4 individuals who have transitioned from homelessness to permanent housing
- Spent \$400 on vehicle improvement assistance
- Spent \$10,125 assisting 30 or more homeless individuals and families



Love INC

From 3/15 - 4/30; Love INC has:

Received more than 431 calls representing 207 different households and met 196 needs including:

- 42 community referrals to food resources
- Connected 31 people to Partner Churches for personal needs items
- Financially assisted 54 households (including housing, rent, utilities, laundry vouchers, and gas cards)
- 69 other needs have been met through partner church ministries such as furniture, diapers, bikes, transportation and tax services
- Prepared 80 personal needs bags with the help of Northridge Church - Thank you to Cornerstone, Whisk and Ivy, and Salvation Army for assisting in the delivery and distribution of these bags into the community.



BY THE NUMBERS...

Based on a County Level Report from March 15, 2020:

- People served - 78 households sheltered
 - 68 were single person households (27 were youth)
 - 6 families (11 adults, 3 children)
- Almost all of these people have been sheltered for the duration of the crisis
