Since 1992, Leadership Livingston has developed over 400 leaders. Many have served in county leadership positions or advanced into leadership roles within their organizations. Beyond skills, participants learn about their community and the issues faced by its leaders. More importantly, participants apply what they learn in an immersive team project. The project focus has varied over the years, but currently involves working with a local nonprofit to identify its mission and strategize its future. This method encourages participants to collaborate with others to achieve an outcome greater than what one could achieve alone.

Participants must attend all sessions to obtain a certificate of completion.
