The HCCC kicked off their awareness-raising efforts with a T-Shirt sale aimed at raising awareness of homelessness in our community and raising funds to support those who are experiencing homelessness. If you purchased your Homeless Awareness Month T-shirt, we encourage you to wear your wear your Homeless Continuum of Care shirt and participate in our community awareness day, **Wednesday, November 11, 2020,** and use the hashtags #endhomelessnesslivco and @homelessccc on your social media platforms. If you missed the opportunity to purchase a t-shirt, please wear purple on November 11 as purple is the color of homelessness awareness.
