> Autism has the highest prevalance of any disability, at 42%. However, some respondents reported multiple disabilites.



Almost 70% of our sample remain unemployed.

55% of those unemployed wish to be employed.


Of the 55% who would like to be employed, **89% most need help finding a unique niche where they can contribute**. Help finding a unique niche was chosen as the greatest need compared with:


- Help finding job openings and applying to jobs (64%)
