OUR LOCAL RESPONSE:

Promote prescribing best practices

The Michigan Opioid Prescribing Engagement Network (Michigan OPEN) gives us 4 reasons to change prescribing practices:

- 1. No correlation between patient satisfaction & amount of opioids prescribed
- 2. 6-10% of surgical patients continue with opioid use after surgery
- 3. There is no correlation between probability of a refill and amount of opioids prescribed
- 4. Greater than 70% of prescribed opioids go unused

Increase treatment capacity

Our goal is to increase the number of physicians X waivered to prescribe buprenorphine in our community. You can utilize the Michigan Opioid Collaborative who assists in X waiver training. The Collaborative also offers one-on-one physician support for treating patients with substance use disorder.

In 2019, the need for a prior authorization for medications used to treat opioid use disorder was removed.
