## Luke Bryan Farm Tour Making A Stop In Fowlerville September 18th

HOWELL, Mich. – The upcoming September 18<sup>th</sup> Luke Bryan Farm Tour concert in Fowlerville is an exciting event for the Livingston County Community and country music fans. In preparation for this event, the Kubiak family, concert personnel, township officials, local and county responders have been working together to organize this event. These organizations have been collaborating and planning to promote safety for participants as they enjoy music, food, friends, and have a great time.

Livingston County will be utilizing a Unified Incident Command structure for the event. The Livingston County Sheriff's Office will be the lead agency with the support and assistance of Fowlerville Fire, Livingston County EMS, Livingston County Central Dispatch, and other county agency partners.

The concert will be held on Sherwood Rd, between Stow Rd and Nicholson Rd. in Conway Township. Sherwood Rd. between Nicholson Rd. and Stow Rd. will be closed to non-concert traffic from 12:00 PM to the end of the event. The concert will be held rain or shine and tickets must be presented to enter the parking area.

Some tips for a safe and fun concert experience:

- Know your route. Prepare and know what roadways will get you to and from the event is important. Have another route planned in the event your initial route is changed due to traffic direction.
- Dress and prepare for the predicted weather, but have options if the weather changes. (This IS Michigan!)
- Don't forget the sunscreen.
- Wear sensible footwear, the concert venue is a farm field.
- Keep valuables close to you.
- Grills and other devices with open flame are not allowed.
- There will be restricted air space. No private drones or UAS.
- Parking begins at 2 P.M. The Concert ground opens at 5 P.M.
- Remember, preparation is the key to a great day.

It is important to know what is and what isn't allowed in the concert venue:

- Blankets and chairs are allowed in designated areas
- NO coolers NO backpacks
- NO outside food or drink
- NO Fireworks
- NO weapons of ANY kind
- NO animals other than service animals
- NO large umbrellas
- NO footballs or frisbees NO hula hoops
- NO private golf carts / UTVs /ATVs
- NO glass containers
- NO re-entry upon exit
- NO video or professional lens cameras
