Michigan Campaign Finance Act Sec. 57 (f). Jay R. Drick coordinated with Livingston Couty Republican Party precinct delegates in advance of the July 22, 2024 County Board of Commissioners meeting to create turn the meeting into a campaign rally for himself and other Commissioners running for re-election. A copy of the coordinating email that was distributed to Mr. Drick and all the other precinct delegates is attached. Mr. Drick used county facilities, county IT equipment and county employees to stage this campaign event. Speakers included the LC GOP Chairman. As the LC BOC Chairman, Mr. Drick invited his close friend, State Representative Robert Bezotte, to present citations to two of the Commissioners running for re-election. This event was not included in the pre-meeting agenda or the approved agenda, so no Commissioner had the opportunity to object to a political campaigning event held during the last LC BOC meeting before the primary election. The presentations were made near the beginning of the meeting, meaning all 15-20 county employees who had business before the LC BOC were forced to watch and applaud. Just before adjournment, Mr. Drick verbally attacked his primary election opponent, including making false and misleading claims about his opponents' personal financial responsibility. Mr. Drick failed to mention that the events in question took place 14 years ago. Mr. Drick referenced his County Commissioner campaign several times. Mr. Drick then went on to make a campaign speech detailing his personal and professional history. He made all of these comments while sitting in the LC BOC seat assigned to the Chair. Commissioner Wesley Nakagiri then used recorded video of Jay Drick's comments to attack Wesley's own opponent on his campaign Facebook page.

Section 15(8) of the MCFA provides that a person who files a complaint with a false certification is responsible for a civil violation of the MCFA. The person may be required to pay a civil fine of up to \$1,000 and some, or all, of the expenses incurred by the Michigan Department of State and the alleged violator as a direct result of the filing of the complaint. MCL 169.215(16).

The financial disclosure acts prohibit a person from filing a complaint with a false certification. MCL 169.313(7); MCL 15.713(7).
