LARGE ITEM DROP-OFF

Deliver your items to the drop-off location, and workers will unload your vehicle or trailer; no need to get out of your car! We will have trucks accepting the list of items below, as well as scrap metal bins.

Large items include: washer/dryers, TVs, patio furniture, grills, old computer equipment, bed springs, mattresses, water heater, furniture, and toys.

Large items not accepted: liquid waste, florescent bulbs, car/boat parts, yard waste, construction debris, railroad ties, motor oil, pesticides, explosives, poisons, hazardous waste, tires, branches, stumps, batteries, liquid paint/solvents, anti-freeze, acid batteries, herbicides, medical waste, sod, rocks, bricks, dirt, automobiles, concrete or asphalt and items that contain freon.

Note: Lawn mowers and/or small engines must have the oil, gas, and tires removed at the time of drop-off.

Proof of residency is required (Example: Driver's License or Property Tax Statement).

HOUSEHOLD BATTERY DISPOSAL

Do you have old/used household batteries to get rid of? Bring it with you and dispose of it the proper way, not in the trash! Also, you can drop household batteries off at Brighton Township Hall in our battery bucket located in the Lobby. ALKALINE - Household Batteries contain heavy metals that can be harmful to the environment if disposed of in a landfill or incinerator. Household batteries are AA, AAA, C, D and other small ones. **Not accepted:** power tool, vehicle and so on.
